Since we came to Tanzania in 2007, Teddy has suffered at least 3 miscarriages and last year gave birth to a little girl who died the next day. Teddy is now 8 months pregnant and doing really well. The joy on their faces and their faith to persevere through the darkest times was a great encouragement to all of us.
